



Internship Program

Position(s) Offered:

MIGE seeks an undergraduate student of geology or earth sciences to serve as an intern during the summer for a period of 1-2 months (negotiable). The student may receive course credit, but will not receive a wage.

Required Experience:

The student need be an undergraduate student studying to receive a bachelor's degree in geology or earth science. He or she must have completed either Introduction to Geography or Introduction to Geology. It is recommended, but not required, that he or she additionally has completed Stratigraphy or Structural Geology.

Position Responsibilities:

The intern will serve as a research assistant to Steven Baumann, founder and CEO of MIGE. He or she will accompany him during field research, mapping, and will assist him in writing and coauthoring publications.

Learning Opportunities:

During the internship, the student will gain valuable experience in various methods of field research and data presentation. Specifically, he or she will receive training in utilizing GIS mapping software. Additionally, the intern will be familiarized with equipment employed by environmental and geotechnical firms and with various techniques for logging samples. The student may even receive course credit.

Career Experience:

By participating as an intern for MIGE, the student will be in an extraordinary position upon his or her graduation. He or she will have made valuable contacts with both environmental and geotechnical firms, as well as county and local government. He or she will also have gained knowledge of the local and state regulations for the establishment of a geoscience company and of the necessary equipment and funding required for such a venture.
